Although her current specialty is using Orff Schulwerk in grades 6, 7, & 8, she has taught all ages of learners from kindergarten through adult. In the summer, she teaches Orff Schulwerk Teacher Education at various universities including the University of St. Thomas, St. Paul, MN. Jo Ella has been included four times in the annual publication of *Who's Who Among American Teachers*. She has presented numerous workshops around the USA, and Canada as well as many AOSA National Conference Sessions. Jo Ella has been a headliner at the National Conference of Carl Orff Canada in 2000 and

2010; has presented for MENC All-Northwest and the MENC 2009 National Conference in Milwaukee. She has a video presentation available at the AOSA Library and is a past president of AOSA.

The Orff-Schulwerk approach encourages students to sing dance and play with a special emphasis on music creativity. The resulting compositions or improvisations are highly sophisticated forms of "knowing in action" that provide ideal opportunities for gauging the richness or depth of a student's musical understanding. This workshop provides models of activities used to elicit students' creative responses as well as procedures that can be used by students and the teacher to help articulate and further develop their own understanding.
